


# **FULLY SERVED**



# SPECIAL EDUCATION CONTINUUM

#### **Preschool Continuum**

For preschool students, the continuum of programs and/or services that may be recommended in the IEP includes:

- related services
- special education itinerant teacher services (SEIT)
- special class in an integrated setting half-day or full day
- special class half day or full day
- NYSED-approved residential placement

#### **School-Age Continuum**

For school-age students, the DOE's continuum of special education services includes:

- general education with related services
- general education with special education teacher support services (SETSS)
- integrated co-teaching (ICT) part-time or full-time.
- special class services (SC) part-time or full-time
- NYSED-approved day and residential placement
- State Supported Schools
- Home/hospital instruction




# PRESCHOOL SERVICES

#### **Preschool Students:**

The DOE <u>Committee on Preschool Special Education</u>
(<u>CPSE</u>) manages the process for preschool children. There are 10
CPSE offices in different areas of the city. Families work with the
CSPE in the district where they live:

- Preschool services can start the year a child turns 3 years old.
   How the process begins will depend on whether
- The child received Early Intervention (EI) services;
- The child is attending a preschool program; or
- The child is in another childcare setting.



# PRESCHOOL SERVICES

- Preschool children (ages 3-5)
- Students attending a private, parochial, charter, State Supported or State Approved Non-Public school in New York City
- Students who live in New York City and attend non-public schools outside New York City and New York State
- Students who receive home or hospital instruction as their placement on their IEP. (This does not include students on temporary home instruction, as these students are expected to return to their prior school)
- Students who are being home-schooled
- Students who are not attending school



# KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS

- Families of children with disabilities entering kindergarten in September will take part in two processes. They are:
- the Kindergarten IEP Process (KIP), which is how special education services and supports are determined for children entering kindergarten.
- Every elementary school is expected to welcome and serve students with disabilities in accordance with their Individualized Education Programs (IEPs). Families of students with disabilities entering Kindergarten in the fall are encouraged to participate in kindergarten admissions in addition to the Kindergarten IEP Process (KIP). - Special Education for Children Entering Kindergarten
- New York City Public Schools (NYCPS) will work with you to consider whether your child needs special education in Kindergarten, and if so, develop an Individualized Education Program (IEP). This is called the "Kindergarten IEP Process" or "KIP," and your participation is important.






# THE KIP REEVALUATION

- The KIP reevaluation is an opportunity to review anticipated progress, pre-academic and academic achievement as well as functional progress, and to determine whether the student meets the special education eligibility criteria for school age services. If necessary to determine eligibility, assessments may be conducted. Best practice preparations for a KIP IEP meeting may include the following:
  - o A review of CPSE assessments
  - A review of all progress reports (including any from private practitioners, if applicable)
  - o A social history update
  - o An updated physical assessment
  - o An observation, if applicable
  - A comprehensive understanding of the student's mastery of, and/or progress toward, age-level goals
  - A review of information gleaned from the student's teacher(s) and/or provider(s)



# TRANSITIONING FROM ELEMENTARY TO MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) in district schools participate in the same middle school admissions process as their non-disabled peers.

The expectations and schedule in middle school may be different from what your child experienced in elementary school. Work with your child's IEP team to determine which supports and services your child will need in middle school. Some things you may want to discuss are:

Special education program options (for example: whether or not your child will need full- or part-time support from a special education teacher and in what subject areas)

Opportunities to be in class with non-disabled peers

Related service duration, frequency, and location


Testing accommodations

Post-secondary goals and transition planning

### TRANSITION PLANNING

- The formal process of transition planning begins in the year which your child turns 12 (or earlier if appropriate).
- The transition planning process is driven by the goals, desires, and abilities of your child.
- A vocational assessment must be completed during the calendar year in which the student turns 12 years of age.
- Starting when your child is 14 years old, the IEP team will begin considering your child's goals for life after high school. These are called measurable postsecondary goals. At the same time the team will consider a coordinated set of transition activities that will support your child to in meeting these postsecondary goals







# 3-K AND PRE-K ADMISSION DATES

- 3-K and Pre-K Applications Deadline
- Remember to submit your application by **Friday**, **February 28, 2025**! If your child was born in 2022, they can attend 3-K this fall. If your child was born in 2021, then they can attend Pre-K this fall.

# MIDDLE SCHOOL ADMISSION UPDATES

- · Middle School Admissions Updates
- The deadline to apply to middle school was Friday, December 20, 2024. If you did not submit an application, please reach out to your child's school counselor. Offers are expected to be released Wednesday, April 9, 2025.
- Changes to Fall 2025 Admissions
- Families can now list any New York City public middle school on their application!
  - Zoned schools will continue to prioritize zoned students for seats.
  - Most programs will also have a district priority, which means that seats will first be filled by students and residents of the district.
  - If seats remain, students and residents from other districts will be considered.
- A strong middle school application:
  - Includes programs in the district(s) where your child lives or goes to school.
  - Includes some programs with an average level of demand (1-2 applicants per seat)
  - The updated Fall 2025 Middle School Admissions Timeline:
- October 15, 2024: Middle School Application Opens (after school hours)
- November 8, 2024: Deadline to register to test for Mark Twain I.S. 239 (21K239) and District 21 Talent Tests
- December 20, 2024: Middle School Application Closes
- April 9, 2025: Middle School Offer Release

# HIGH SCHOOL OFFERS

 If your child applied to high school for fall 2025 by the December 9, 2024, deadline, you will receive their high school offers by March 6, 2025. You will be notified by email to log into your MySchools account to view the offer and any waitlist placements (if applicable), along with information on next steps. Upon request, parents have the right to interpretation at special education meetings, and translation of IEPs, assessments and notices. You can request language access services by speaking with a member of your child's IEP team. You can also request a translation of your child's IEP by visiting schools.nyc.gov/IEPHello or by calling 718-935-2013. If you have concerns regarding language access services, please follow the escalation process described on the DDE's website (at <a href="schools.nyc.gov/connect-with-us">schools.nyc.gov/connect-with-us</a>). If your concern is not resolved at the school or district level, you may file a complaint. 

A Comparable Service Plan (CSP) will be created for your child by the new school or the Committee on Special Education (CSE), using information shared by you or the Family Welcome Center. This plan will ensure immediate support for your child.



Once your child is attending school, a team will begin the evaluation process for a formal Individualized Education Program (IEP). You will be asked for written consent for evaluations, so providers can determine the most appropriate supports, programs, and services. Together you will create a personalized plan to ensure your child has full and equal access to public education.
