Mayor Mamdani Releases New York City's First Citywide Racial Equity Plan

- 8 Citywide goals to address racial disparities including:

● **Early Childhood Education:** By 2034, reduce achievement gaps and racial disparities in literacy, numeracy and social-emotional development by expanding and improving early childhood education while advancing job quality for child care workers – the majority of whom are women of color.

● **K-12 Education:** By 2034, increase the number of integrated New York City public schools with stable enrollment, equitable access to academic programs and services, and culturally responsive leadership that improves belonging, engagement and academic outcomes for Black and Latino students, multilingual learners, students with disabilities and other historically underserved communities.
